

BASIC CAR MAINTENANCE CHECKLIST

Please note that the service schedule outlined below is just a suggestion and should be adjusted to match the recommendations of your vehicle's manufacturer outlined in your owner's manual.

SAFETY ITEMS	WHEN TO CHECK	DATE SERVICED
Windshield wipers - replace if damaged	Monthly	
Windshield washer fluid - refill when low	Monthly	
Lights/blinkers – test to ensure working	Monthly	
Hazard lights – test to ensure working	Monthly	
Warning lights – look for illuminated lights	Monthly	
FLUIDS	WHEN TO CHECK	DATE SERVICED
Oil	Every 3 months	
Coolant / Antifreeze	Every 3 months	
Transmission	Every 6 months	
Brake	Yearly	
Transfer case (4WD / AWD)	Yearly	
FILTERS	WHEN TO CHECK	DATE SERVICED
Oil filter	Every 3 months	
Air filter	Every 3 months	
Cabin air filter	Yearly	
Fuel filter	Yearly	

ENGINE	WHEN TO CHECK	DATE SERVICED
Battery - check for corrosion	Every 3 months	·
Hoses - look for signs of wear	Every 6 months	
Belts - check for cracks	Every 6 months	7
Spark plugs	Every 3-4 years	
Exhaust system	Yearly	
Air conditioning system	Yearly	
BRAKES	WHEN TO CHECK	DATE SERVICED
Brake pads - inspect for wear	Every 6 months	
Parking brake - test to ensure working	Every 3 months	
TIRES	WHEN TO CHECK	DATE SERVICED
Tread - look for excessive wear	Monthly	
Tire pressure - check pressure in each tire	Monthly	·
Rotation	Every 6 months	
STEERING & SUSPENSION	WHEN TO CHECK	DATE SERVICED
System inspection	Yearly	
Alignment	Every 1-2 years / or with tire replacement	

NORMAL VS SEVERE DRIVING

Your car manual may list two different service schedules based on normal and severe driving. Normal driving is commuting with mostly highway miles while severe driving is defined by driving in stop-and-go traffic, making frequent short trips, towing, and traveling in the mountains, on dusty dirt roads and in temperature extremes.
